




The presence of children in worship is to be celebrated. As Jesus said, “Let the little children come...” We know that means they will come with noises and wiggles and giggles and questions. We welcome ALL the things that come along with having children in worship.

Children learn by watching and doing what others do, so let them participate in all aspects of worship. Here are some suggestions that will help you worship together as a family:

- Talk about church before Sunday. Tell your children how the adult worship service is different from children's church.
- Grab a children's worship bag. The activities in this bag go along with the scripture focus for worship. Let your child do these activities while listening to the sermon.
- Avoid screen time during worship. This will enable your child to more fully engage in worship and sets an example of focusing on God during this time.
- Make sure your child brings their Bible. After you sit down in your seat, find the scripture focus for the day and mark it in your child's Bible.

Children ages 4 through 2nd grade are invited to join Mrs. Jennifer in Children's Church after the children's sermon. If you need to feed or change your child during worship, a changing table and sitting area is located in the Dixie Street sanctuary entrance.
